Program Notes

Music for Winter Solstice 2024: Luminous Night

NCS Music Director Dr. Minji Kim often arranges her choral programs using sets, much like acts in a play or chapters in a book. Each section builds on each other until the program produces a journey using the most intimate of instruments, the human voice. Our program begins acapella (without instrumental accompaniment) which is the purest and most difficult choral singing.

Set I

Dr. Kim chose the traditional form of the prelude to begin this concert. But Ola Gjeilo's "Prelude" is hardly conventional. Gjeilo tells us on his website that he practices the most famous preludes, those of Johann Sebastian Bach's *Well-Tempered Clavier*, every day. But Gjeilo is also fascinated by the work of early medieval composer Hildegard von Bingen. Borrowing as much from Bach as from Hildegard's chants, the harmonies of Gjeilo's "Prelude" are open and expansive, evoking a sense of inexplicable wonder appropriate to the holiday season.

Gjeilo was born in Norway, a country known for having some of the darkest nights in the world and a place to experience the kaleidoscopic displays of the aurora borealis. Although Gjello currently lives in New York City, the harmonies of his "Luminous Night of the Soul" furnish us with a sound track for imagining the vivid hues of the northern lights. The text is drawn from two sources, combining the poetry of Charles Anthony Silvestri with a quote from St. John of the Cross. From the very first rehearsals NCS singers immediately felt a sense of awe while singing "Luminous Night of the Soul." We hope you, too, imagine the magical night sky as these brilliant tones dispatch the darkness of early winter.

Set II

Minji chose two arrangements of one of the oldest carols referencing the Virgin Mary for this second set. In early psalters, the Christ child is represented as a das blülein, or small rose bud, springing from a branch. In early Christian imagery, this branch is simultaneously a branch from a sapling and a schematic rendering of human generations, or a genealogy, in the form of a family tree. This particular genealogy connects the bibles' old and new testament, beginning with Jesse, the father of King David. "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming" was originally harmonized by the German medieval composer Michael Praetorius in 1609. Minji chooses to present this German carol first using just a string quartet in an arrangement by contemporary Irish composer

Thomas Quigley. Then the chorus will sing an arrangement by Craig Hella Johnson, who creatively pairs "Lo, How a Rose" with "The Rose," a pop song written by American singer-songwriter Amanda McBroom in the late 1970s. In this medley the two stylistically different songs about a rose converge, symbolizing both the birth of Christ and the rosette's universal themes of hope and love.

"The Christmas Star" was composed by Waldo Beach, the father of chorus member Betsy Beach. Waldo was an amateur musician who used his interest in choral composition to write new musical settings of Christmas hymns for their annual holiday card and holiday sing. He presented these arrangements every year for 30 years, enough to fill and publish two books! Betsy is thrilled that Dr. Kim has selected one of her father's arrangements for this concert.

Set III

Again, like scenes in a play or chapters in a book, the most compelling stories present contrasting characters. This set is made up of two very different pieces. "The Chanukah Song (We Are Lights)," was written by Stephen Schwartz, composer of the acclaimed Broadway musicals "Wicked," "Pippin," and "Godspell." The song's lyrics include the powerful line: "We are miracles lighting up the dark. We are lights of memory, remembering times long gone. We are glowing, glowing miracles, we are lights, shining on and on." This piece will be dedicated to the memory of Newburyport Choral Society singers who have passed away, as well as to current members who are courageously and resiliently battling illness. Its words serve as a reminder, regardless of where we are or where we may be, to remember one another. In honoring those who have come before us and supporting those with us today, we renew a spirit of everlasting hope and love that transcends time and grief.

"A Jubilant Song" was composed by Norman Dello Joio, a prolific 20th-century American choral composer born to Italian immigrant parents. Dello Joio's unconventional compositional style earned him numerous prestigious awards, including the Pulitzer Prize for music. The text, adapted from Walt Whitman's poem *A Song of Joy*, expresses a celebration of a life full of music. Likewise, the chorus sings, shouts, and sways with pulsing syncopation, onomatopoeia and an explosive accompaniment that constantly shifts from one key to another.

Set IV

Following the annual Newburyport Choral Society December sing-along is a set of carol arrangements by composer, conductor and teacher Alice Parker. Born in Massachusetts, Alice Parker became one of the most influential figures in American choral music through her extensive work with Robert Shaw at the Boston Symphony's summer festivals at Tanglewood, MA and the Robert Shaw Chorale in Atlanta, GA. Alice Parker passed away this

last December, notably on the morning of Christmas Eve 2023. Over a long career, her pieces have become a standard part of the choral repertoire, beloved for their warmth, beauty, and depth. It is only recently that her arrangements of carols were compiled and published as a collection. Tonight, we celebrate her legacy by sharing this set of seven carols, as they continue to inspire and delight choirs and audiences around the world.

Set V

We conclude today's concert with two pieces specifically wishing everyone a season shared with friends and family. Judy Garland first sang "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" in the 1944 movie *Meet Me in St. Louis* during a wistful scene set on Christmas Eve. It was written to express hope for the future and became most popular among United States troops serving abroad during World War II. In contrast, "Feliz Navidad," written by Puerto Rican composer José Feliciano, celebrates the present moment of happiness and the anticipation of a prosperous new year. Whatever you are feeling, dear audience, the Newburyport Choral Society wishes you and yours a holiday season filled with music.

Dr. Minji Kim brings her passion for music to life as the Music Director of the Newburyport Choral Society. She believes in the power of human connection through choral singing. An inspiring educator, Dr. Kim's conducting philosophy emphasizes community-building, trust, and love. Her rehearsals bring joy, energy, and focus to the ensemble.

Dr. Kim's conducting and performances have been recognized for their excellence. She has served as a chorus master for the National Symphony Orchestra and Baltimore Symphony Orchestra. Her performance of Mozart's *Vesperae Solennes de Confessore* with the University of Maryland Summer Chorus was selected as a finalist for the 2019-2020 American Prize. She was a selected finalist for the 2021 American Choral Directors Association Graduate Student Conducting Masterclass, a conducting fellow at the 2019 National Collegiate Choral Organization masterclass with María Guinand, and a fellow conductor and singer with the Yale Norfolk Chamber Choir with Simon Carrington.

In addition to her role with NCS, she is an Assistant Professor of Music at Gordon College in Wenham, MA, where she conducts college choirs and teaches courses on Beginning and Advanced Conducting, Choral Literature and Methods, and Music in Worship. She is a frequent presenter on Korean Contemporary Choral Composers and Performance Practice. Previously, she

directed the University Chorale and Chamber Consort and taught undergraduate classes at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. She conducted and assisted the Chamber Choir, University Chorale, and Treble Choir as part of her doctoral studies at the University of Maryland. She earned her Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) in Choral Conducting from the University of Maryland, a Master of Music (MM) from Ohio State University, and a Bachelor of Music in Composition from Yeungnam University in South Korea.

Kirsten Helgeland, Collaborative Pianist



Kirsten Helgeland holds degrees in piano performance from the Eastman School of Music and the College Conservatory of Music of the University of Cincinnati. She also holds a Ph.D. in musicology from the University of Cincinnati. During her seven years on the music faculty of Gordon College, she taught music history, music theory, and piano, coached instrumentalists and vocalists, and served as accompanist for Gordon's Children's Choir and Symphonic Chorale. After

leaving Gordon, she opened Studio K, a teaching studio in Beverly, Mass. In 2018, she was voted a Top Music Teacher by M. Steinert & Sons, the Boston area's authorized Steinway dealers.

She has held recitals in Ohio, Vermont, Massachusetts, and Illinois, in addition to appearing as a guest artist on WGBH-Radio's Chamberworks. She has presented lecture-recitals to the American Musicological Society and the Society for American Music. She has also worked as Organist and Choirmaster in Cincinnati and as a public school music teacher in Massachusetts.

Since 2005, she has served as accompanist to the Newburyport Choral Society and as Music Director and Organist at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Beverly. She lives in Amesbury, with her husband, Roger Cramer, a retired Episcopal priest and practicing potter.



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


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
